## **Assessment Tips for Multimedia Assignments**



Multimedia Assignments present a unique challenge in assessment, since a degree of the criteria is qualitative rather than quantitative.

## **PURPOSE**

» Multimodal learning, writing, and creation can increase student engagement at all levels. Creating a clear grading rubric for assessment of these projects assists students in feeling confident that they can meet or exceed expectations for success.

## PROCEDURE

- » Determine the learning outcomes for your assignment, and base your grading criteria primarily on those.
- » Decide whether you are going to create an analytical or holistic rubric.
  - » Analytic rubrics identify and assess components of a project
  - » Holistic rubrics assess student work on the project as a whole
- Include some quantitative criteria, such as number of sources, number of images, at least three of

the following media types, etc.

- » Explain and discuss with the class any qualitative criteria.
- » Explain weighting of criteria when applicable.

## **CONSIDERATIONS**

 Student technical abilities will be of differing levels - sometimes pairing students or creating groups for projects can overcome the digital divide or student fear.
Faculty are encouraged to partner with their institutions technical staff to support multimedia assignments.
